**3. Committee:** Courts of Justice

**4. Title:** Universal licensure for certain law-enforcement officers.

**5. Summary:** Provides that any sworn federal, state, or local law-enforcement officer with at least three years of experience whose training qualifications meet or exceed current training standards established by the Board of Criminal Justice Services and who has not had a break in service of more than three years, and is leaving the transferring agency in good standing, shall be eligible for employment within the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions.
