**5. Summary:** Requires health insurance carriers to provide coverage for contraceptive drugs and contraceptive devices, including those available over-the-counter, in accordance with §§ 38.2-3442 and 38.2-3438, Code of Virginia. The bill prohibits a health insurance carrier from imposing upon any person receiving contraceptive benefits pursuant to the provisions of the bill any copayment, coinsurance payment, or fee, except in certain circumstances.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed legislation is expected to have a fiscal impact on the state health plan. According to the Department of Human Resource Management, the estimated annual fiscal impact to the state health plan is \$1,963,000 to provide coverage for contraceptive drugs and devices. The employer costs are approximately 50 percent of the general fund impact and 50 percent of the nongeneral fund impact.
