**3. Committee:** Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources

**4. Title:** Department of Environmental Quality; data; groundwater and surface water withdrawal permits.

**5. Summary:** Authorizes the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to utilize and incorporate comprehensive groundwater, surface water, and aquifer data in its decision-making processes related to the issuance and renewal of groundwater withdrawal permits and surface water withdrawal permits. Such data may include information relating to water levels, flow rates, and water quality.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary. See item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The bill allows DEQ to use groundwater, surface water, and aquifer data in permitting decisions. DEQ averages one annual permit in tidal areas. The cost of incorporating this data is estimated at \$100,000 per permit. These amounts would be passed through to an agency such as the Virginia Institute of Marine Science, or the Marine Resources Commission, if DEQ chose to use the allowance provided in the bill.
