3. Committee: Education and Health

4. Title: Central fill pharmacies.

5. Summary: Establishes requirements for central fill pharmacies, which are defined in the bill as permitted pharmacy facilities that, upon the request of an originating pharmacy, perform the product fulfillment of a drug order and return the filled prescription to the originating pharmacy for delivery to the patient or patient's agent or, for non-federally controlled substances, send the filled prescription directly to the patient. The bill contains an enactment clause that directs the Board of Pharmacy to adopt emergency regulations to implement the provisions of the bill.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Minimal.

8. Fiscal Implications: This legislation would have a minimal fiscal impact on the Board of Pharmacy to promulgate regulations, which can be handled within existing resources.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Department of Health Professions.

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No.

11. Other Comments: The Board of Pharmacy shall promulgate regulations to implement the provisions of this act to be effective within 280 days of its enactment. HB1166, introduced by Delegate Wyatt, is a companion bill.
