3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Deferred or installment payment agreements; certain benefits; maximum amounts to be paid.

5. Summary: This bill amends § 19.2-354.1 (Deferred or installment payment agreements) by requiring the court to inform any defendant entering into a payment agreement that no payment is required if such defendant's sole financial resource is a Social Security benefit or Supplemental Security income. The bill also specifies that, if such defendant has an additional non-exempt financial resource or source of income, no payment required can exceed the maximum amount that would be subject to garnishment under Article 7 (§ 8.01-511 et seq.) of Chapter 18 of Title 8.01 and § 34-29.
