5. Summary: The substitute bill amends § 19.2-354.1 (Deferred or installment payment agreements) by providing that in any case in which a defendant owes fines and costs and where such defendant's sole financial resource is a Social Security benefit or Supplemental Security Income, then such defendant is exempt from making payments at least until such time that such defendant has a resource other than a Social Security benefit or Supplemental Security Income. If such defendant informs the court that his sole financial resource is a Social Security benefit or Supplemental Security Income, the case cannot be referred to collections pursuant to § 19.2-349 (governs collections and disposition of fines). Courts are required to include in payment plan policies developed in accordance with §§ 19.2-354 and 19.2-354.1 that where the court is informed that a defendant receives a Social Security benefit or Supplemental Security Income, no payment toward fines and costs can be taken from such exempt resource.

The substitute bill also provides that no Social Security benefit or Supplemental Security Income can be considered an available resource in determining the length of time to pay under a deferred, modified deferred, or installment payment agreement and the amount of payments.
