In accordance with the provisions of 30-19.03 of the Code of Virginia, the staff of the Commission on Local Government offers the following analysis of legislation impacting local governments.

SB 70: SNAP; employment and training (McPike)

Bill Summary: Requires all local departments of social services to offer an employment and training program for SNAP benefits program participants.

Summary Analysis:

Number of Localities Responding: 4 Cities, 3 Counties, 3 Towns, 0 Other

Localities estimated a negative fiscal impact ranging from \$0 to \$4 million over the biennium.

Localities that already provide employment and training programs indicated no fiscal impact. Responsive Towns indicated that this is a County expense.

Localities that do not already provide a program indicated recurring personnel and operating costs ranging from \$110,000 associated with one employee to \$4 million associated with 21 additional employees depending on the locality's SNAP caseload and uptake.

Chesterfield	No Impact. We currently operate a SNAP EandT program. I do not see any additional fiscal impact as we receive an allotment (31,600) and the state has a small local match on funds. The benefit of us administrating the program exceeds the costs associated with it.

Fauquier	I'm estimating some operating costs as well as the addition of one staff member to administer the training. The costs represented would be the estimated local share.					
	Looking at the November report we had 5328 households receive SNAP, \$1,744,508 of benefits given out.					
	Thinking about workload, if a worker could handle 250 cases, provide case support, education and training on employment to the household, that would be 21 additional workers we would need. At a salary of at least \$41,000 per year, add benefits, supplies and office space.					
Rockingham County	We have no open offices, so we would need to acquire furniture and office space for each additional case worker.
