10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 32.1-170 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 32.1-170. Regulations.
13	A. The regulations of the Board governing waterworks, water supplies, and pure water shall be
14	designed to protect the public health and promote the public welfare and shall include criteria and
15	procedures to accomplish these purposes.
16	The regulations may include, without limitation:
17	1. Requirements and procedures for the issuance of permits required by this article;
18	2. Minimum health and aesthetic standards for pure water;
19	3. Minimum standards for the quality of water which may be taken into a waterworks;
20	4. Criteria for the siting, design, and construction of water supplies and waterworks;
21	5. Requirements for inspections, examinations, and testing of raw or finished water;
21 22	6. A requirement that owners submit (i) regular samples of water for bacteriological, chemical,
23	radiological, physical, or other tests or (ii) the results of such tests from such laboratory as may be
24 25	acceptable to the Commissioner;
	7. Requirements for record keeping and reporting;
26	8. Methodology for determining the waterworks operation fee authorized by § 32.1-171.1; and
27	9. Such other provisions as may be necessary to guarantee a supply of pure water.
28	B. In establishing the requirements and procedures for the issuance of permits, the Board shall not
29	require the waterworks owner to maintain or retain at least one individual licensed as a professional
30	engineer in Virginia with at least two years' experience in the design and construction of water
31	distribution systems; the Board's requirements for engineering expertise shall be no more stringent than

the requirements for state and local employees as set forth in Chapter 4 (§ 54.1-400 et seq.) of Title
54.1.
