## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 54.1-2971.1 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia 3 by adding a section numbered 32.1-45.3, relating to HIV testing of gamete donors.

## Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6

7 1. That § 54.1-2971.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of 8 Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 32.1-45.3 as follows: 9

§ 32.1-45.3. Certain testing of gamete donors required; Board to establish testing protocol.

10 Any person using donor gametes to treat patients for infertility by artificial insemination, in vitro fertilization, gamete intrafallopian tube transfer, or zygote intrafallopian tube transfer or any other 11 12 gamete, zygote or embryo transfer or other intervening medical technology using sperm or ova, shall, 13 prior to using any donor gametes for such procedures, ascertain the HIV status of the donor through 14 testing as provided in Board of Health regulations. The Board of Health shall promulgate regulations 15 establishing a testing protocol for gamete donors.

16 As used in this section:

"Donor" means an individual unrelated by marriage to the recipient who contributes the sperm or 17 ova used in the procedures noted above. 18

19 "Gametes" means either sperm or ova.

20 § 54.1-2971.1. Disclosure for certain treatment of infertility.

21 Before a physician commences treatment of a patient by in vitro fertilization, gamete intrafallopian 22 tube transfer, or zygote intrafallopian tube transfer, including the administration of drugs for the 23 stimulation or suppression of ovulation prefatory thereto, a disclosure form shall have been executed by 24 the patient which includes, but need not be limited to, the rates of success for the particular procedure at 25 the clinic or hospital where the procedure is to be performed. The information disclosed to the patient 26 shall include the testing protocol used to ensure that gamete donors are free from known infection with 27 human immunodeficiency viruses, the total number of live births, the number of live births as a 28 percentage of completed retrieval cycles, and the rates for clinical pregnancy and delivery per completed 29 retrieval cycle bracketed by age groups consisting of women under thirty years of age, women aged 30 thirty through thirty-four years, women aged thirty-five through thirty-nine years, and women aged forty 31 years and older.

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
