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HOUSE BILL NO. 1976

A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 24.2-405, 24.2-406, and 24.2-418 of the Code of Virginia, relating to voter registration; lists of registered voters and persons voting and registration applications.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 24.2-405, 24.2-406, and 24.2-418 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as 11 12 follows:

§ 24.2-405. Persons who may obtain lists of registered voters.

14 The State Board shall furnish, at a reasonable price, lists of registered voters for their districts to (i) courts of the Commonwealth and the United States for jury selection purposes, (ii) candidates for 15 election or political party nomination to further their candidacy, (iii) political party committees or 16 17 officials thereof for political purposes only, (iv) incumbent officeholders to report to their constituents, and (v) nonprofit organizations which promote voter participation and registration for that purpose only. 18 The lists shall be furnished to no one else and used for no other purpose, except that the State Board is 19 20 authorized to furnish information from the voter registration system to general registrars for their official 21 use.

22 In no event shall any printed precinct list furnished under this section contain the social security 23 number of any registered voter except a list furnished to a court of the Commonwealth or of the United States for jury selection purposes. 24

25 Any printed precinct list furnished under this section shall contain the post office box address in lieu 26 of the residence street address for any active or retired law-enforcement officer, as defined in § 9-169 27 and in 5 U. S. C. A. § 8331 (20) but excluding officers whose duties relate to detention as defined in 28 paragraphs (A) through (D) of § 8331 (20), who has furnished at the time of registration or 29 subsequently, in addition to his street address, a post office box address for his residence for use on 30 such lists. 31

§ 24.2-406. Persons who may obtain lists of persons voting at primaries and elections.

32 The State Board shall furnish to candidates, elected officials, or political party chairmen and to no one else, on request and at a reasonable price, lists for their districts of persons who voted at any 33 34 primary or general election held in the two preceding years. Such lists shall be used only for campaign 35 and political purposes and for reporting to constituents.

36 In no event shall any printed precinct list furnished under this section contain the social security 37 number of any registered voter.

38 Any printed precinct list furnished under this section shall contain the post office box address in lieu 39 of the residence street address for any active or retired law-enforcement officer, as defined in § 9-169 40 and in 5 U. S. C. A. § 8331 (20) but excluding officers whose duties relate to detention as defined in 41 paragraphs (A) through (D) of § 8331 (20), who has furnished at the time of registration or 42 subsequently, in addition to his street address, a post office box address for his residence for use on 43 such lists. 44

§ 24.2-418. Application for registration.

Each applicant to register shall provide, subject to felony penalties for making false statements 45 pursuant to § 24.2-1016, the information necessary to complete the application to register. Unless 46 47 physically disabled, he shall sign the application. The application to register shall be only on a form or forms prescribed by the State Board. **48**

The form of the application to register shall require the applicant to provide the following 49 50 information: full name, including the maiden name and any other prior legal name; age; gender; date 51 and place of birth; social security number, if any; whether the applicant is presently a United States citizen; address and place of abode and date of residence in the precinct; place of any previous 52 53 registrations to vote; and whether the applicant has ever been adjudicated to be mentally incompetent or 54 convicted of a felony, and if so, under what circumstances the applicant's right to vote has been 55 restored.

The form shall permit any active or retired law-enforcement officer, as defined in § 9-169 and in 5 56 57 U. S. C. A. § 8331 (20) but excluding officers whose duties relate to detention as defined in paragraphs (A) through (D) of § 8331 (20), to furnish, in addition to his residence street address, a post office box 58 59 address for his residence to be included in lieu of his street address on the lists of registered voters and

60 persons who voted which are furnished pursuant to §§ 24.2-405 and 24.2-406.
