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12 13	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
13	1. That § 58.1-4022 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
14	§ 58.1-4022. State Lottery Fund.
15	A. All moneys received from the sale of lottery tickets or shares, less payment for prizes and
16	compensation of agents as authorized by regulation and any other revenues received under this chapter,
17	shall be placed in a special fund known as the "State Lottery Fund." Notwithstanding any other
18	provisions of law, interest earned from moneys in the State Lottery Fund shall accrue to the benefit of
19	such Fund.
20	B. The total costs for the operation and administration of the lottery shall be funded from the State
21	Lottery Fund and shall be in such amount as provided in the general appropriation act. Appropriations to
22	the Department during any fiscal year beginning on and after July 1, 1989, exclusive of agent
23	compensation, shall at no time exceed ten percent of the total annual estimated gross revenues to be
24	generated from lottery sales. However, should it be anticipated at any time by the Director that such
25	operational and administrative costs for a fiscal year will exceed the limitation provided herein, the
26	Director shall immediately report such information to the Board, the Governor and the Chairmen of
27	Senate Finance and House Appropriations Committees. From the moneys in the Fund, the Comptroller
28	shall establish a special reserve fund in such amount as shall be provided by regulation of the
29	Department for (i) operation of the lottery, or (ii) use if the game's pay-out liabilities exceed its cash on
30	hand.
31	C. Any start-up sums appropriated from the general fund of the Commonwealth necessary to
32	commence operation of a state lottery shall be repaid within the first twelve months of initial lottery
33	sales.
34	D. Appropriation of lottery revenues shall be made only upon actual and audited collections as
35	transferred to the general fund and shall in no event be predicated upon an estimation of such revenues.
36	No later than ten days after receipt of the audit report required by § 58.1-4023, the Comptroller shall
37	transfer to the general fund, less the special reserve fund, the audited balances of the State Lottery Fund.
38	Beginning with lottery profits collected from lottery sales on or after July 1, 1996, one-third of the
39	amount so transferred to the general fund shall be distributed among the counties and cities of the
40	Commonwealth.
41	One-half of the amount distributed to any county or city shall be based on such county's or city's
42	annual lottery sales compared to the Commonwealth's. The remaining one-half shall be based upon each
43	county's and city's school-age population according to the most recent statewide census of such
44	population taken by the Department of Education pursuant to § 22.1-284.
45	The amounts shall be distributed within thirty days after the Comptroller transfers the audited
46	balances of the State Lottery Fund to the general fund.
47	The amounts distributed to any county or city shall be used by such county or city for capital outlay
48	projects, including the repayment of debt and interest thereon incurred for any such capital outlay
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50	E. As a function of the administration of this chapter, funds may be expended for the purposes of
50 51	reasonably informing the public concerning (i) the facts embraced in the subjects contained in
51 52	subdivisions 1 through 7 of subsection A of § 58.1-4007 and (ii) the fact that the net proceeds are paid
52 53	into the general fund of the Commonwealth; but no funds shall be expended for the primary purpose of
53 54	inducing persons to participate in the lottery.
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
