14	Administration in 1992, 579 (49 percent) occurred at railroad crossings; and	H
15	WHEREAS, despite efforts by the General Assembly, the Department of Transportation, local	11
16	governments, and the railroad industry, there still remain in Virginia many locations where highways	U
17	cross railroad tracks at grade, without a bridge or underpass; and	
18	WHEREAS, particularly in eastern Virginia, topography makes construction of grade-separated	
19 20	railroad crossings difficult, time-consuming, and expensive; and	
20	WHEREAS, it is highly desirable that all appropriate steps be taken to eliminate as many at-grade	
21 22	highway/railroad crossings as possible and render the remainder as safe as they can be; now, therefore, be it
