9	WHEREAS, the problems of the homeless, especially homeless families, continue to plague the cities
10	and towns of the Commonwealth; and
11 12	WHEREAS, a group in Norfolk, in operation since 1991, has developed a range of innovative,
12	effective, and cost-efficient programs to deal with the problems of homeless families; and WHEREAS, originated by a small group of citizens from the Ocean View section of Norfolk, the
14	Haven Family Center opened its first building, a renovated HUD-owned boarding house, in 1991; and
15	WHEREAS, thanks to the tireless efforts of its founders, the first Haven Family Center won an
16 17	architectural excellence award and the Norfolk Mayor's Award; and WHEREAS, dedicated to improving the lives of its clients, the Haven Family Center has developed
18	and implemented several innovative programs to help homeless families with immediate emergency
19	assistance, followed by an extended program to provide extra time to allow families to regain their
20	independence; and
21 22	WHEREAS, the Haven Family Center designs programs to achieve a permanent solution to the problems of homeless families—programs that transfer the responsibility from the welfare system back
$\frac{22}{23}$	to the individual family—and then offers the support needed by families to cope with this responsibility;

25	WHEREAS, in addition to Crisis Shelter and Extended Shelter programs, the Haven Family Center
26 27	offers a Transitional Housing program, a Permanent Housing program, and Project P.I.E., an employment program to help families achieve self-sufficiency; and
28	WHEREAS, among its goals for the 1996 fiscal year, the Haven Family Center plans to provide
29	Crisis Shelter for 83 families, Extended Shelter for 36 families, and such additional services as job
30 31	search and employment assistance, educational assistance, and apprenticeship programs; and
31 32	WHEREAS, by focusing on permanent solutions to the problems of the homeless, the Haven Family Center provides both the vitally necessary emergency assistance to families in need and the long-term
33	help so important to the rebuilding of strong, independent, productive families; now, therefore, be it
34	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly
35 36	commend the Haven Family Center of Norfolk for its extraordinarily creative and effective efforts to help homeless families; and, be it
30 37	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution
38	for presentation to Elizabeth Brickhouse, executive director, as an expression of the General Assembly's
