A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 36-99 and 63.1-174.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Uniform Statewide Building Code and adult-care residences.

10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 36-99 and 63.1-174.1 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: 11 § 36-99. Provisions of Code. 12

13 The Building Code shall prescribe building regulations to be complied with in the construction of 14 buildings and structures, and the equipment therein as defined in § 36-97, and shall prescribe regulations to insure that such regulations are properly maintained, and shall also prescribe procedures for the 15 administration and enforcement of such regulations. The provisions thereof shall be such as to protect 16 the health, safety and welfare of the residents of this Commonwealth, provided that buildings and 17 structures should be permitted to be constructed at the least possible cost consistent with recognized 18 standards of health, safety, energy conservation and water conservation and barrier-free provisions for 19 20 the physically handicapped and aged. Such regulations shall be reasonable and appropriate to the 21 objectives of this chapter.

22 In formulating the Code provisions, the Board shall have due regard for generally accepted standards 23 as recommended by nationally recognized organizations, including, but not limited to, the standards of 24 the Southern Building Code Congress, the Building Officials Conference of America and the National 25 Fire Protection Association.

26 Where practical, the Code provisions shall be stated in terms of required level of performance, so as 27 to facilitate the prompt acceptance of new building materials and methods. When generally recognized 28 standards of performance are not available, such provisions shall provide for acceptance of materials and 29 methods whose performance has been found by the Board, on the basis of reliable test and evaluation 30 data, presented by the proponent, to be substantially equal in safety to those specified.

In formulating the Code provisions, the Board shall not adopt provisions that limit the right of 31 32 disabled persons to live in housing of their choice, but shall establish procedures for an individualized showing, taking into account the needs and circumstances of the person subject to the regulation, that 33 34 such a restriction is necessary in a particular case. The Board shall incorporate into the Code 35 provisions for reasonable variances from the Code to permit disabled persons to reside in the housing 36 of their choice. 37

§ 63.1-174.1. Compliance with Uniform Statewide Building Code.

38 Buildings licensed for independently mobile residents, semimobile residents or nonambulatory 39 residents shall be classified by and meet the specifications for the proper Use Group as required by 40 *meet the requirements of the Virginia Uniform Statewide Building Code.*
