1	SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 137
2	AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
3	(Proposed by the Senate Committee on Rules
4	on February 10, 1994)
5	(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Trumbo)
6	Expressing the sense of the General Assembly concerning plans for the TransAmerican Transportation
7	Corridor (I-66) and Interstate Route 73.
8	WHEREAS, the 1991 U.S. Department of Transportation Appropriations Act included provision for
9	the study of an interstate highway from Detroit, MI, to Charleston, SC, to be known as Interstate Route
10	73; and
11	WHEREAS, the 1994 U.S. Department of Transportation Appropriations Act included provision for
12	the study of an interstate linking the east and west coasts of the United States, herein referred to as the
13	TransAmerican Transportation Corridor (I-66); and
14	WHEREAS, different communities in Virginia have passed conflicting individual recommendations
15	for these interstate highways; and
16	WHEREAS, the entire western, southwestern, and central part of Virginia will benefit when these
17	interstate highways are developed; and
18	WHEREAS, a coordinated effort is necessary by all communities in the areas to be affected by these
19	interstate highways to secure this benefit to these areas; and
20	WHEREAS, that coordinated effort should focus on routes which maximize the benefits of linking
21	these two interstate highways; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly request
23	all parties to coordinate their efforts to locate these highways for maximum benefit for all Virginians;
24	and, be it
25	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the TransAmerican Transportation Corridor (I-66) should generally
26	follow a route entering Virginia at Interstate Route 64, in the Allegheny Highlands, following it to its
27	intersection with U.S. 220, then south to the Roanoke Valley, then continuing east along the U.S. Route
28	460 corridor to an eastern terminus at the seaport of Norfolk; and, be it
29 30	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Interstate Route 73 generally follow a route entering Virginia near
30 31	Bluefield and the U.S. Route 460 corridor, following that general corridor through Giles County to Montgomery County, then intersect Interstate Route 81, which should be widened in the process, then
31 32	follow Interstate Route 81 to the Roanoke Valley, then proceeding south through Henry County
32 33	following generally the U.S. Route 220 corridor; and be it
33 34	RESOLVED FINALLY, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit copies of this resolution to the
35	Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President of the United States Senate, and
36	the members of the Virginia Congressional delegation so that they may be apprised of the sense of the
37	Virginia General Assembly on these matters.

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
