10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That §§ 28.2-100, 28.2-102, and 28.2-104 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as
12	follows:
13	§ 28.2-100. Definitions.
14	As used in this title, unless the context requires a different meaning:
15	"Commission" means the Marine Resources Commission.
16	"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Marine Resources.
17	"Director" means the Director of the Marine Resources Commission.
18	"Fish" or "marine fish" means those finfish species which spend a major portion of their lives in
19	marine or estuarine waters. Sunfish, crappies, and carp are not considered to be marine fish.
20	"Fishing", "fisheries" or "to fish" means all operations involved in (i) taking or catching, (ii) using,
21	setting or operating apparatus employed in killing, taking or catching, or (iii) transporting or preparing
$\overline{22}$	for market marine fish, shellfish, and marine organisms.
23	"Habitat" means those state-owned bottomlands, tidal wetlands and coastal primary sand dunes which
24	are subject to regulation under Subtitle III of this title.
25	"Marine organisms" means those species other than marine finfish or marine shellfish which inhabit
26	marine or estuarine waters. Terrapin and marine mammals are considered to be marine organisms.
27	"Marine shellfish" or "shellfish" means such species of mollusca as oysters and clams, and such
28	species of crustacea as crabs.
29 29	"Officer" means a member of the Virginia Marine Patrol.
<u>30</u>	"Territorial sea" means the waters within the belt, three nautical miles wide, that is adjacent to
30 31	Virginia's coast and seaward of the mean low-water mark.
32	"Tidewater Virginia" means the following counties: Accomack, Arlington, Caroline, Charles City,
33	Chesterfield, Essex, Fairfax, Gloucester, Hanover, Henrico, Isle of Wight, James City, King and Queen,
34 35	King George, King William, Lancaster, Mathews, Middlesex, New Kent, Northampton, Northumberland,
	Prince George, Prince William, Richmond, Spotsylvania, Stafford, Surry, Westmoreland, and York; and
36	the Cities of Alexandria, Chesapeake, Colonial Heights, Fairfax, Falls Church, Fredericksburg, Hampton,
37	Hopewell, Newport News, Norfolk, Petersburg, Poquoson, Portsmouth, Richmond, Suffolk, Virginia
38	Beach, and Williamsburg.
<b>39</b>	§ 28.2-102. Commission membership; chairman; qualifications; terms; meetings.
40	A. The Commission shall consist of a chairman and eight additional nine members who, to the
41	extent possible, shall be representative of all areas of interest in Virginia's marine resources, including
42	commercial, recreational and environmental interests. At least one member shall, at the time of his
43	appointment, have earned his livelihood for at least five years by working on Virginia waters and at
44	least one member shall have expertise in fisheries management and related education. The members,
45	including the chairman, shall be appointed by the Governor and shall serve at his pleasure. The
46	Commission shall elect a chairman for among its members.
47	B. The chairman and two members of the Commission shall hold office for terms coincident with the
<b>48</b>	term of the Governor making the appointments, or until their successors have been appointed and
49	qualified. The remaining six members shall be appointed for four-year terms or until their successors are
50	approved and qualified. No person, except the chairman, shall serve more than two consecutive full
51	terms. Any vacancy shall be filled by the Governor for the unexpired term.
52	C. The chairman shall be an experienced administrator with knowledge of seafood and marine affairs.
53	He shall serve as Commissioner of Marine Resources.
54	$\oplus C$ . Five members shall constitute a quorum of the Commission.
55	ED. The Commission shall meet on the call of the chairman or three members at such times as he or
56	they may deem necessary, and at such places as he or they may designate.
57	§ 28.2-104. Director; general powers and duties.
58	The CommissionerDirector shall:
59	1. Enforce the marine fishery and habitat laws and regulations;

60 2. Serve as chief executive officer of the Marine Resources Commission and devote full time to the 61

duties of the office exercise such administrative powers and duties as are conferred upon him by the Commission; and further, the Commission may delegate to him any of the powers and duties invested in 62

it by this title except the adoption and promulgation of standards, rules and regulations; 63
