6	Directing the Virginia State Crime Commission to study the compensation of non-sworn
7	law-enforcement personnel in sheriffs' offices.
8	WHEREAS, non-sworn law-enforcement personnel in sheriffs' offices include dispatchers, secretaries,
9	clerks, and other support personnel; and
10	WHEREAS, such personnel play a vital role in preserving public safety in Virginia; and
11	WHEREAS, such personnel deserve to be adequately compensated for the invaluable service they
12	provide to the citizens of the Commonwealth; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, compensation, including salaries, for such personnel is inadequate to keep pace with the
14	rising cost of living; and
15	WHEREAS, compensation, including salaries, for such personnel is well below comparable positions
16	in state government; and
17	WHEREAS, such lower compensation results in high turnover and low morale among the personnel;
18	now, therefore, be it
19	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia State Crime
20	Commission be directed to study the compensation of non-sworn law-enforcement personnel in sheriffs'
21	offices. The Commission shall examine the salaries of non-sworn law-enforcement personnel in sheriffs'
22	offices and compare such compensation to that of comparable positions in state government. The
23	Commission shall also examine methods to fund salary re-grades for such personnel where necessary.
24	Upon request, all agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission.
25	The Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the
26	Governor and the 1997 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division

of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.

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
