5 1	Expressing the sense of the General Assembly concerning the Dulles Toll Road.

8 9	WHEREAS, Chapter 221 of the 1979 Acts of Assembly authorized the issuance of \$57 million in
9 10	bonds for the purpose of construction of the Dulles Toll Road; and
11	WHEREAS, prior to construction of the facility, a financial feasibility study was conducted to
12	determine the toll structure necessary to provide sufficient revenues to cover the costs of operations,
13	maintenance, and debt service requirements; and
14 15	WHEREAS, construction of the Dulles Toll Road began in 1982 and the facility was opened to
15 16	traffic on October 1, 1984; and WHEREAS, Chapter 620 of the 1989 Acts of Assembly authorized the issuance of \$33.915 million
17	(plus financing expenses) in additional bonds to fund widening the Dulles Toll Road by one lane in
18	each direction; and
19	WHEREAS, construction of these additional lanes was begun in 1989 and completed in 1992, also
20	providing for a flyover for Virginia Route 7 and improvements to the main toll plaza; and
21 22	WHEREAS, in October 1992, the Commonwealth Transportation Board created the Dulles Toll Road Special Advisory Committee to seek viable solutions to future congestion within the Dulles Corridor;

24	WHEREAS, among the Committee's recommendations was the installation of an automatic vehicle
25	identification system; and
26	WHEREAS, in March 1994, the Department of Transportation awarded a contract for such
27 28	installation, with implementation in the fall of 1995; and WHEREAS, the 1995 Session of the General Assembly authorized the issuance of a further \$47.17
20 29	million in bonds (plus additional amounts to cover issuance costs, reserve funds, and other financing
30	expenses) for the purpose of funding all or a portion of the costs incurred for additional widening of the
31	Dulles Toll Road and improvements to the Wiehle Avenue interchange, for which projects consultant
32	contracts have been awarded and construction is underway; and
33 34	WHEREAS, the Dulles Toll Road has been successful in generating revenue; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Department of
34 35	Transportation be urged to discontinue and remove the tolls imposed for use of the Dulles Toll Road,
36	when all [presently existing] legal obligations requiring the use of toll revenues from this facility have
37	been fulfilled; and, be it
38	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit copies of this resolution
