| 11 | Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: |
| 12 13 | 1. That § 36-99.11 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: |
| 13 14 | § 36-99.11. Identification of handicapped parking spaces by above grade signage. A. All parking spaces reserved for the use of handicapped persons shall be identified by above grade |
| 15 | signs, regardless of whether identification of such spaces by above grade signs was required when any |
| 16 | particular space was reserved for the use of handicapped persons. A sign or symbol painted or otherwise |
| 17 | displayed on the pavement of a parking space shall not constitute an above grade sign. Any parking |
| 18 | space not identified by an above grade sign shall not be a parking space reserved for the handicapped |
| 19 | within the meaning of this section. |
| 20 | B. All above grade handicapped parking space signs shall have the bottom edge of the sign no lower |
| 21 | than four feet nor higher than seven feet above the parking surface. Such signs shall be designed and |
| 22 | constructed in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform Statewide Building Code. |
| 23 24 | C. Building owners shall install above grade signs identifying all parking spaces reserved for the use |
| 24 25 | of handicapped persons in accordance with this section and the applicable provisions of the Uniform Statewide Building Code by January 1, 1993. |
| 2 6 | D. The foregoing provisions of this section shall not apply in any county, city, or town wherein the |
| 27 | governing body by ordinance requires the owner or occupant of any privately owned parking area open |
| 28 | to the public to maintain the signs and markings required by the Uniform Statewide Building Code to |
| 29 | designate parking spaces reserved for the handicapped to the same standards of the Uniform Statewide |
| 30 | Building Code in effect at the time the parking area was constructed. |

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
