3 4 5	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 2 of Title 28.2 an article numbered 8, consisting of sections numbered 28.2-245, 28.2-246, and 28.2-247, relating to the establishment of the Fishery Resource Grant Program.

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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 2 of Title 28.2 an article numbered
13	8, consisting of sections numbered 28.2-245, 28.2-246, and 28.2-247, as follows:
14	Article 8.
15	Fishery Resource Grant Program.
16	§ 28.2-245. Fishery Resource Grant Program established; Consortium to administer; purpose;
17	eligibility.
18	A. There is hereby created, within the Virginia Sea Grant Program, the Fishery Resource Grant
19	Program which shall be administered by the Graduate Marine Science Consortium at the University of
20	Virginia.
<b>2</b> 1	B. The purpose of the Fishery Resource Grant Program is to protect and enhance the
22	Commonwealth's coastal fishery resources through the awarding of grants in the following areas:
$\frac{1}{23}$	1. New fisheries equipment or gear;
24	2. Environmental pilot studies on issues including water quality and fisheries habitat;
25	3. Aquaculture or mariculture of marine-dependent species; or
26	4. Seafood technology.
27	C. The Consortium shall advertise the availability of grant funds and shall solicit, receive, and
28	review grant applications. Grants shall be awarded by the Consortium after consideration of the
29	recommendations of the Fishery Resource Grant Advisory Board. The decisions regarding who receives
30	the grant awards shall be the responsibility of the Consortium. Commercial fishermen who currently
31	possess a commercial license pursuant to § 28.2-241 shall be the only persons eligible to receive grants
32	under this program.
33	D. The Consortium may establish a peer review panel to assist in determining the relative merits of
34	each proposal.
35	E. Any general funds for the Fishery Resource Grant Program shall be appropriated to the
36	Consortium, which shall be reimbursed for the reasonable costs incurred in administering and
37	monitoring the grant program. If funds remain at the end of a grant cycle, the Consortium may carry
38	forward such funds to the next funding cycle.
39	§ 28.2-246. Fishery Resource Grant Advisory Board established; membership; duties.
40	A. The Fishery Resource Grant Advisory Board shall be composed of seven members to be selected
41	in the following manner: five members shall be appointed by the Graduate Marine Science Consortium
42	from nominations made by commercial watermen's associations, one member shall be appointed by the
43	Commissioner of the Marine Resources Commission, and one member shall be a appointed by the
44 45	Director of the Virginia Institute of Marine Science.
45	B. The Advisory Board shall (i) in cooperation with commercial fishermen and the Consortium,
46 47	establish by July 1 of each year, the priority areas in which grants shall be awarded and (ii) review

40 49	At the end of each grant cycle, the Graduate Marine Science Consortium shall submit a report to the
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50 51	Committee on the Chesapeake and Its Tributaries; the House Committee on Appropriations; the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources; the Senate Committee on Finance; the
51 52	Marine Resources Commission; and the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services
53	describing the projects funded and moneys expended.
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
