1 VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER 2 An Act to amend and reenact § 22.1-208.01 of the Code of Virginia, relating to character education 3 programs. 4 [S 817] 5 Approved Whereas, Virginia has implemented a new system for school accreditation which is based on student 6 7 achievement on the Standards of Learning assessments; and 8 Whereas, in some schools, the learning environment must be improved to enhance the quality of 9 instruction and increase the opportunities to learn; and 10 Whereas, young people respond well to being accorded respect, understanding, and encouragement; 11 and 12 Whereas, projects across the United States have shown that public schools can teach good character; 13 and 14 Whereas, character education can improve the behavior and enhance the future of our young 15 children; and Whereas, implementation of character education requires strong community involvement and 16 17 unwavering commitment; and 18 Whereas, successful character education programs also require state commitment to support and 19 coordinate the programs and to ensure accountability; now, therefore, 20 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 22.1-208.01 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 21 22 § 22.1-208.01. Character education required. 23 A. Each school board shall establish, within its existing programs, a character education program in 24 its schools. The purpose of the character education program shall be to instill in students civic virtues 25 and personal character traits so as to improve the learning environment, promote student achievement, 26 reduce disciplinary problems, and develop civic-minded students of high character. The components of 27 each program shall be developed in cooperation with the students, their parents, and the community at 28 large. The basic character traits taught may include (i) trustworthiness, including honesty, integrity, 29 reliability, and loyalty; (ii) respect, including the precepts of the Golden Rule, tolerance, and courtesy; (iii) responsibility, including accountability, diligence, perseverance, and self-control; (iv) fairness, 30 31 including justice and freedom from prejudice; (v) caring, including kindness, empathy, compassion, 32 consideration, generosity, and charity; and (vi) citizenship, including concern for the common good, respect for authority and the law, and community-mindedness. 33 34 Classroom instruction may be used to supplement a character education program; however, each 35 program shall be interwoven into the school procedures and environment and structured to instruct primarily through example, illustration, and participation, in such a way as to complement the 36 37 Standards of Learning. 38 This provision is intended to educate students regarding those core civic values and virtues which 39 are efficacious to civilized society and are common to the diverse social, cultural, and religious groups 40 of the Commonwealth. Nothing herein shall be construed as requiring or authorizing the indoctrination 41 in any particular religious or political belief. 42 B. The Board of Education shall establish criteria for character education programs, consistent with 43 the provisions of this section. To assist school divisions in implementing character education programs 44 and practices that are designed to promote the development of personal qualities as set forth in this section and the Standards of Quality and that will improve family and community involvement in the 45 public schools, there the Board of Education shall be established also establish, within the Department 46 of Education, the Commonwealth Character Initiative. This unit The Board shall provide resources and 47 48 technical assistance to school divisions regarding successful character education programs. The unit and shall (i) identify and analyze effective character education programs and practices and (ii) collect and 49 50 disseminate among school divisions information regarding such programs and practices and potential funding and support sources. Such unit The Board may also provide resources supporting professional 51 52 development for administrators and teachers in the delivery of any character education programs. 53 C. The Board of Education shall award, with such funds as are appropriated for this purpose, grants 54 to school boards for the implementation of innovative character education programs.
